<u> School Uniform ~ Gentle Reminder</u>

School uniform does not have to have the school badge on it and so you are free to purchase uniform anywhere. We would also be very grateful if you could donate any good quality uniform so that we can use in school or redistribute to anyone who needs it. Uniforms should be washed and handed into the school office, even if it is after the summer. Please also remember we have a rail of pre-loved uniform in the school foyer which is available for anyone to help themselves.

<u>Free School Meals and Transport</u>

If you are in receipt of Housing Benefit and/or Council Tax Reduction you are automatically entitled to free school meals. If you do not receive these benefits but feel you are eligible, you should apply online using the South Lanarkshire Council website. Parents will also have to apply for school transport by going online either to the North Lanarkshire Council or South Lanarkshire Council website and searching for school transport.

Primary Expansion

The school continues to be modernised by South Lanarkshire Council and there are 3 projects planned:

- 1. The extension of the dining hall area
- 2. The extension and modernisation of the school kitchen
- 3. The enhancement of the outdoor area of the nursery cabin

We had hoped that the extension to the dining area would begin over the summer holidays, however, this will now not take place until late September. The other 2 projects will take place over the summer holidays in 2024.
