Chairperson report

• Kevin discussed the overall meeting notes and key aspects of the parent council. He also discussed the impacts of school day and new opportunities that have been set up (no mobile phone). - Financially, mentioned different ways to help enhance reading schemes and musical equipment within the school.

Treasurer's Finance Report

Head Teacher Report

- New Director of Education in role, with positive first impressions and looking for stability after a busy period.
- Mentioned kitchen is now fully functional and working, making life much easier for all.
- The roof is looking good so far, and he pitch is being actively chased up to see a latest update on when this may be started.
- The nursery will have a canopy installed to help for pupils to get ready when outside/inside and an additional one at the front for parents waiting.
- Discussed the new priorities for 25/26.
- Curriculum evening will give an opportunity to share and showcase new learning and structures that are in place such as Active Literacy.
- The school role has changed from 339 to 331 which has reduced classes by one.

- Mrs Clark discussed a parent/pupil discussion that will take place to look at which ways some of the PEF funding will be used
- Asked for volunteers to discuss with pupils for an hour between 2-3pm on 22nd Sept.

Attachment

- Mrs McNulty discussed meeting needs of pupils for attachment, she is looking to complete, to do this she is looking for a group to work with the pupils on an ongoing basis to see how pupils can help feel supported within the culture of the school.
- This can be done at a time that suits parents.
- Chrissy Denham and Fiona Vornic offered to support.

Smartphone Free Childhood

- Looking for new members in our team,
- Some new parents have already signed up to have pupils not have a mobile phone within primary school.
- Possibly looking to expand their presence into the nursery to help early engagement.
- Question asked about informal learning for parents in terms of the dangers of iPad/phones. Possibly revisit this for parents,
- Ruth mentioned there is a WhatsApp group for updates.
- Another request to add the Padlet onto the school website, which would make updates quicker and easier.

Summer Fete

- Helen mentioned possibility of a new sub-group for next year, which she can share the details for each stall as required.
- It gives opportunity to involve others with planning.
- Feedback that within our own school it was able to allow pupils to feel more confident and great links with the parish.
- It had a great community feeling.

Use of Parent Council Funds

- Discussed potential of buying new books to help facilitate over new reading schemes.
- Question on swimming lessons for primary 5, the issue being the cost of the buses.
 The lessons are manageable however the costs of the buses are causing more
 issues towards the cost of the school day. Going ahead this year however will need
 to be revisited at the end of the year to see if it is viable.
- Question of a leaver's hoodie funding again this year?

- Question about primary 5 potentially doing their own fundraising for swimming lessons.
